Reminder: "Illness and Medication"

Illness

Your child's health is a matter of major importance to us. It is imperative that your child does not come to school while he or she is sick. It is against Children "R" Us policy for your child to be accepted in school while he/she is sick. Please respect the health and well being of other children and the policy of Children "R" Us by adhering to the Illness and Medication Policy.

If your child becomes ill while at children "R" Us, you will be requested to pick your child up immediately. In such an event, your child will be isolated from the other children until you arrive. The following guidelines should be considered in determining if your child should be kept out of the center:

Keep your child home if he or she has any of the following:

- 1) A fever (or has had one in the past 24-hour period).
- 2) A consistent cough, wheezing, nasal discharge, sneezing, vomiting, or diarrhea.
- 3) Symptoms of communicable disease. (These are usually sniffles, reddened eyes, sore throat, headache, and abdominal pain, plus a fever). Please notify the director at once if your child does have a communicable disease.

Medication (Effective: September 7, 2012, Children "R" Us will not administer Medication)

Medication permit must accompany a doctor's excuse, authorizing a medical clearance into school. All medication given to a child at Children "R" Us must be authorized by a written statement from the physician and/or parent. All medication must be in the original container, indicating the child's name, type and date of prescribed medication, amount and time of dosage.

When medication is brought to Children "R" Us, it is to be given to a staff member so that it can be stored properly. A medication sheet must be completed and signed by the parent. *Thank you for adhering to our Illness and Medication Policy and thank you for choosing Children "R" Us.*

Please see the Site Director for special medical conditions such as asthma.
